

News from the Coalition

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and October 17 is the 10th annual Indigenous Pink Day, highlighting the importance of breast cancer screening.

Results of the Native Urban Elder Needs Assessment Survey indicate that a significant proportion of female Native urban Elders do not have mammograms every other year, which is the schedule recommended by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force.

A total of 789 women answered the survey's question about the length of time since their last mammogram. Of those women, 11.5% said at least 5 years had gone by, and 5.3% said they had never had a mammogram.

Thank you for your continued advocacy to improve these numbers and make sure Native urban Elders get timely screenings for breast cancer. The more people get screened, the more frequently breast cancer can be caught early enough to help save lives.
